

Post-Accident Procedures

Being involved in an accident can be stressful regardless of severity or who is at fault. It is important to remain as calm as possible and complete the following steps to ensure the accident is handled properly:

- Stop immediately after being involved in any accident and stay composed;
- 2. Confirm that you have not been seriously injured;
- Turn on your four-way signaling devices and set out warning flares or devices to alert other traffic to steer clear of the scene;
- 4. Notify law enforcement of the accident;
- Check for injuries to any other parties involved;
- Document the accident and take photos of your vehicle, any other involved vehicles or equipment, as well as the surrounding area;
- Notify your company of the accident and the location of where it occurred; and
- 8. Complete a preliminary accident report that has been provided by your company.

When involved in any accident it is extremely important to do your best to manage the situation. That begins by making sure you are not seriously injured and that there are no other injuries as a result of the accident. Try to gather as much information as possible about the incident. If the media is present, it's usually best not to discuss the accident with reporters or journalists and usually appropriate only to speak with designated company or law enforcement personnel at the scene. While no one wants to be involved in an accident, it is important to be prepared and know how to react when an incident occurs.
