


Construction Zone Safety

According to the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration trucks have more accidents in highway work zones than any other type of vehicle. It is important to always stay alert and be aware of your surroundings since work zones can be dangerous.

Here are some helpful tips to help improve safety while driving through work zones:

- Be patient—pick a lane and stay in it.
- Don't jockey for position when approaching a construction zone—and don't speed up after the construction zone to make up for lost time.
- Always keep a safe following distance. Use the foursecond rule and expect sudden stops.
- Watch for warning signs. Expect erratic behavior from motorists.
- Slow down.
- Turn on your headlights.
